A PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPERTY TAX

RATE will be held at 6 p.m., Aug. 11, at which time citizens may be heard on the property tax rate proposed to be set by the City of Skidmore. The tax rate shall be set to produce the revenue, which the budget for the year 2026 shows to be required from the property tax. Each tax rate is determined by dividing the amount of revenue required by the current assessed valuation. The result is multiplied by 100, tax rate is expressed in cents per \$100 valuation.
